RTW Checklist

Please provide your Right to Work documentation.

If you can provide documentation from List A, there is no restriction on their right to work in the UK.

List A:

Acceptable documents:

1. A passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK.
2. A passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
3. A Registration Certificate or Document Certifying Permanent Residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
4. A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
5. A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
6. A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
7. A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
8. A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
9. A birth (short or long) or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
10. A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, together with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

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Proof of Name & Address

You cannot use one form of identification for both name and address.

For example, if you provide your driving licence as proof of your name you must provide another form of identification for your address, such as a utility bill for your address.

Utility bill (gas, electric, satellite television, landline phone bill) issued within the last three months

1. Local authority council tax bill for the current council tax year
2. Current UK driving licence
3. Bank, Building Society or Credit Union statement or passbook dated within the last three months
4. Original mortgage statement from a recognised lender issued for the last full year
5. Solicitor's letter within the last three months confirming recent house purchase or land registry confirmation of address
6. Council or housing association rent card or tenancy agreement for the current year
7. Benefit book or original notification letter from Benefits Agency (but not if used as proof of name)
8. MRC self-assessment letters or tax demand dated within the current financial year
9. Electoral Register entry
10. Pay slip from Previous Employer
